The Advanced LLM in Energy Law Programme is designed to equip lawyers to operate in this demanding environment.

Our society is changing continuously and at an increasing pace. Energy law should follow these changes which are occurring now and in the future. In this dynamic field of work, we offer legal professionals a programme based on excellent fundamental knowledge and conceptual tools, connected with society and with a forward-looking view.

The programme is drawing on the expertise of the four partner universities in centres of excellence. Moreover located in the region that has seen perhaps the highest degree of innovation in energy law.



Accredited joint post-graduate degree programme for professionals

This unique programme is structured to accommodate the busy professional through concentrated periods of teaching. Each of the four courses is taught at a different University in an intensive two-week module.

The language of instruction is English. Field visits connect energy law knowledge with practice.

The 2025-2027 round of the Advanced LLM will start in October 2025 and lasts until September 2027. Modules can be studied on an independent basis by those who do not wish to follow the full LLM.

The programme consists of the following interrelated components, each with a broad, international and comparative perspective:

- Liberalising and Regulating the Energy Market, University of Groningen
- Climate Change and the Energy Transition, University of Copenhagen
- Energy Security, Safety and Investment Protection, University of Aberdeen
- Energy Trade Law and Energy Contracting, University of Oslo

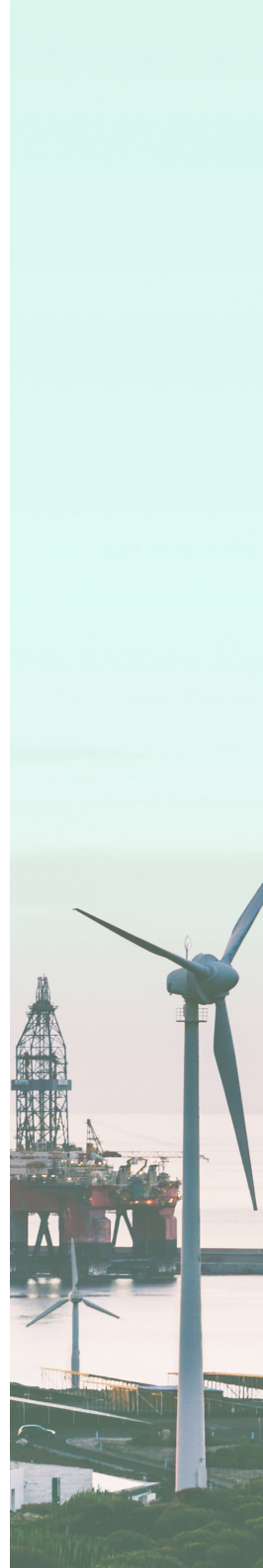
